The Virginia Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) is directed by Chapter 80 Article 6 (Permits for New and Modified Stationary Sources) of the Virginia Regulations for the Control and Abatement of Air Pollution to take certain actions following receipt of an Air Permit application. Section 9VAC5-80-1160.B. states "Within 30 days after receipt of an application, the board will notify the applicant of the status of the application." Dear Mr. Hartz:

This letter acknowledges receipt of your permit application dated September 11, 2015 to construct and operate a natural gas compressor station near Woods Corner in Buckingham County Virginia. The Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) Blue Ridge Regional Office staff has completed its initial review your application. Based on that review, the proposed request has been determined to be subject to the permitting requirements of Chapter 80, Article 6 of the Virginia Regulations for the Control and Abatement of Air Pollution. Please note, however, that this determination is subject to change upon further review.

Based upon this initial review, the application contains sufficient information to begin the application review process. Additional information will be needed before the application may be considered complete:

- Following receiving a Special Use Permit from Buckingham County the applicant should submit a Local Governing Body Certification Form signed by the authorized local official, certifying that the proposed facility is consistent with local ordinances pursuant to Chapter 22 (§§15.1-2200 et seq.) of Title 15.2 of the Code of Virginia (see page 3 of the application form). The regulations require that an owner comply with any existing zoning ordinances and regulations in the locality in which a source is proposed to be located.

In order to further clarify your application, please provide the following information:

- Copies of electronic spreadsheets used to calculate emissions for the application.

- Modeling information for the application will be needed. The details of the information needed should be coordinated with Mike Kiss located in DEQ's Central Office in Richmond, VA. He can be contacted at by phone at 804-698-4460 or by email at Michael.Kiss@deq.virginia.gov.

It is important that you provide the required information above so that the engineering staff can complete the review of your application in a timely manner.

If a later analysis of the permit application indicates that additional information is required to support your application, such information will be requested at that time.

You are reminded that construction of a compressor station subject to the permitting requirements in Chapter 80 of the Virginia Regulations for the Control and Abatement of Air Pollution, without the appropriate new source review permit, can result in enforcement action.
